The United States Bankruptcy Court for the Middle District of North Carolina is pleased to announce the establishment of a mentoring program to help provide assistance to less experienced attorneys practicing in the Middle District.

Attorney Participation: Attorneys with significant bankruptcy experience may participate as a mentor in the program by completing the attached Pro Bono Mentor Form and submitting it to the Clerk of Court. A less experienced attorney seeking the assistance of a mentor may participate by completing the attached Mentor Request Form and submitting it to the Clerk of Court.

Assignment of the Mentor: The list of pro bono mentor attorneys is maintained by the Clerk of Court. After submission of the Mentor Request Form, the Clerk of Court will assign a mentor from the list. However, the program is voluntary and no attorney is required to accept an assignment as a mentor. Volunteers may decline an assignment for any reason, and if an assignment is declined, the Clerk of Court shall select another mentor from the list for assignment. An attorney may leave the pro bono mentor list by writing a letter to the Clerk of Court.
